

# Moments in Time

# **Bethel History - 1921-1940**

In 1927, William McElroy was installed, at the age of 70, and became the oldest pastor to serve Bethel. He was described as "very vigorous and could wear down the average youngster during a day's hunting", according to the book by Anna Lee Kirkwood Smith. Later he broke his leg while tending to his cow, developed a blood clot and died 10 days later.

In 1926, the first pipe organ was bought and installed. In 1933, more land was purchased, and a fence erected around the cemetery and the road stoned. In 1934, Westminster Fellowship was begun and was open to anyone in their teen years.

After Stewart McKenzie was installed as pastor in 1935, he became instrumental in organizing and leading the first Boy Scout troop at Bethel. The sponsorship of a troop continues to the present day. In 1940 Mr. McKenzie also started the Schooner Club, a group for young married couples, the name reflecting couples "embarking on the sea of matrimony." Mrs. Smith also says many of the members of the club stated that while participating in the club's many worthwhile projects they received training in leadership and it aided much in their spiritual life. In 1944-48, the club published a church newsletter, The Bethel Log, copies of which are in the church archives. The Schooner Club remained in existence until very recently.

A celebration was held in 1938 to mark the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the building of the new church. This is also the year that Laura Cairnes wrote her book about the history of Bethel.
