
Peter opens the suitcase to inspect the worldly items that the man found too precious to leave behind and exclaims, "You brought pavement?!!!"

#### Bethel History - 1961-1980

In 1961, Bethel's pastor was Johannis Mol, a native of the Netherlands who had emigrated to Australia after the World War II. During the war, he had been a Nazi prisoner of war for having been part of the Dutch resistance. While serving Bethel, he also earned a Doctorate in Philosophy from Columbia University in New York, specializing in the impact religion played in the adjustment of immigrants. This seems to be a particularly fitting topic for Bethel.

1962 saw the ordination of Eugene Bay. He had been a member of Bethel all his life and was the son of Walter and Kathleen Bay. Both his parents were very active members including being on the Session, Mrs. Bay being one of the first two women elders, and Eugene is the only known 'home grown" pastor Bethel has ever produced. He is now retired and visited Bethel in May of 2019 for our Sesquibicentennial celebration.

The celebration of the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Bethel was held in 1969. It was at this time that Anna Lee Kirkwood Smith wrote her book of Bethel history. On the cover is a very fitting quote from Ecclesiastes 1:4, "One generation passeth away and another generation cometh but the earth abideth forever." In this year, also, the present manse was built, the old one being sold to a Bethel family.

A handbell choir was started in 1977 using borrowed bells from Highland Presbyterian Church. The wife of the then pastor, Brenda Grauer, started, trained and directed the choir, which was later taken over by MaryLee Kegley Swift (1983-1989) and Nancy Smith Rose directed the youth hand bell ringers (1986-2006) and then later the adult hand bell ringers (1990-2006). A set of 3 octave bells was bought in 1979.
