As we enter a season of sacred thought the following is a guideline for prayer, contemplation and meditation and Study of the Word. This month I am sharing with the construct for you to read, absorb and practice with you favorite scripture. Next month and at other times in the coming months I will share a bible study using this same format.

"Lectio Divina", a Latin term, means "divine reading" and describes a way of reading the Scriptures whereby we gradually let go of our own agenda and open ourselves to what God wants to say to us. In the 12th century, a Carthusian monk called Guigo, described the stages which he saw as essential to the practice of Lectio Divina. There are various ways of practicing Lectio Divina either individually or in groups but Guigo's description remains fundamental.

He said that the first stage is lectio (reading) where we read the Word of God, slowly and reflectively so that it sinks into us. Any passage of Scripture can be used for this way of prayer but the passage should not be too long.

The second stage is meditatio (reflection) where we think about the text we have chosen and ruminate upon it so that we take from it what God wants to give us.

The third stage is oratio (response) where we leave our thinking aside and simply let our hearts speak to God. This response is inspired by our reflection on the Word of God.

The final stage of Lectio Divina is contemplatio (rest) where we let go not only of our own ideas, plans and meditations but also of our holy words and thoughts. We simply rest in the Word of God. We listen at the deepest level of our being to God who speaks within us with a still small voice. As we listen, we are gradually transformed from within. Obviously, this transformation will have a profound effect on the way we actually live and the way we live is the test of the authenticity of our prayer. We must take what we read in the Word of God into our daily lives.

These stages of Lectio Divina are not fixed rules of procedure but simply guide-lines as to how the prayer normally develops. Its natural movement is towards greater simplicity, with less and less talking and more listening. Gradually the words of Scripture begin to dissolve, and the Word is revealed before the eyes of our heart. How much time should be given to each stage depends very much on whether it is used individually or in a group. If Lectio Divina is used for group prayer, obviously more structure is needed than for individual use. In group prayer, much will depend on the type of group. Lectio Divina may involve discussing the implications of the Word of God for daily life but it cannot be reduced to this. The movement of the prayer is towards silence. If the group is comfortable with silence, more time could be spent resting in the Word.

The practice of Lectio Divina as a way of praying the Scriptures has been a fruitful source of growing in relationship with Christ for many centuries and in our own day is being rediscovered by many individuals and groups. The Word of God is alive and active and will transform each of us if we open ourselves to receive what God wants to give us.

I will hear what God proclaims; the LORD—for he proclaims peace to his people. Near indeed is his salvation to those who fear him, glory dwelling in our land. Kindness and truth shall meet; justice and peace shall kiss. Truth shall spring out of the earth, and justice shall look down from heaven. The LORD himself will give his benefits; our land shall yield its increase. Justice shall walk before him, and prepare the way of his steps.



Bethel History - 2001-Present

As we come to the current time period, we start a new millennium and Bethel entering its 4th century. Many new events have occurred, and some old ones continued or revived. We were blessed to have the benefit of 3 Associate Pastors during this time. Rev. James Cole, Rev. Nam Min and Rev. Vicki Kennedy served under the direction of the then current pastor. Also, during this time, we had the services of 4 interim pastors, Revs. David Harris, Mary Morgan, John Potter and Richard Sheffield.

The position of Coordinator of Children, Youth and Family Programs was begun with the hiring of Chrissie Galliher. She directs the Sunday School and arranges the annual Vacation Bible School, both of which are open to not only church members but to the community as well. She directs other projects thru out the year, as needed.

The Boy Scout troop sponsorship, begun in the early 1940s, is still thriving at Bethel to this day.

Many of the programs started in the 90s continue to the present. This includes the Mission trips, the spaghetti dinners and the 70 luncheons. Habitat for Humanity has ceased to build houses in this county due to the high cost of land, but the church has continued with monetary contributions toward the cost of rehabbing several houses.

In 2013, Bethel celebrated the 125th anniversary of the building of the present sanctuary, built in 1888. This beautiful sanctuary has been the church home for countless local families and represents the cycles of life for the congregation.

Our current pastor, Rev. Todd Smith, came to Bethel in 2015. A year-long celebration has been planned for 2019 as we celebrate 250 years of Bethel Church. Given Bethel's long history and strong member dedication we believe it will continue to serve its members and its community for many more generations as it has served every generation since 1769.
