Peters anxiety is at the heart of his faltering. Our anxiety is the same. Life is uncertain and even though we seek to meet all of life's challenges with a bold faith as humans our faith often falters. We often see the words "you of little faith" as a scathing rebuke of Peter when what it really is, is an acknowledgement of the human condition and an assurance that when we falter Jesus is present. The word in Greek is Ogliopistos.



#### Pisteu faith

Because we are human our faith is not a perfected one. We will falter, doubt, and become anxious. We will do, say, and think things that fall short of God's intention for us and we may begin to sink but Peter's example to us is a model of what our response should be in times of distress.

When he cried out his eyes were focused on Christ and Jesus reached out to him immediately and caught him. Our trust in him is never a mistake and all life's challenges, walking on water in this case, are possible. When we waiver in the midst of those challenges he catches us too if we but only reach out to him! Jesus offers the same redemptive hand and loving fellowship. He understands our shortcomings and fears and meets us in love.



# Session Summary

The Session held a regular meeting on January 16, 2020. The meeting was called to order by Rev. Todd Smith, devotion led by Ruling Elder Sherry Kirchner who also led us in prayer.

#### Clerk's Report per Rev. Todd Smith

Approved November 21<sup>st</sup>, 2019 session meeting minutes.

Communion held Sunday November 1, 2019 in pew, December 24, 2019 in pew and January 5, 2020 by Intinction.

Pulpit Supply is needed for June 7, 2020 as Pastor Todd will be vacationing after his wedding.

#### Moderator's Report

Professional Development Week for Pastor Todd was discussed. He will be working on 2 Kings 4:1-7 for study.

Maryland State Boychoir advertising with Armstrong Cable was discussed. The cost will be \$75. The funds will come from the Evangelism/Special Events line item in the budget. Appd.

Lenten Services will be held at Ayres Chapel United Methodist Church. Bethel is assigned Wednesday, March 4, 2020 to bring the bread and soup and Pastor Todd will do the service.

Habitat for Humanity project would entail Bethel building a wall for a home that would be built in either Harford County or Cecil County. We will inquire within our community if there is an interest for participation. Pastor Todd and Elder Rita Cairnes will coordinate these efforts. Consensus to move forward with this project was yes.

Sunday Service overhead PowerPoint presentations need individuals to operate the laptop. Session members agreed to help with this task. Melissa will put together a schedule.

Director of Christian Education, Chrissie Galliher, has made an appeal to have more people of Bethel involved with the CE Committee. She is need of teachers and help with the Nursery. Asking for suggestions on how to get more participation.

The Lake House and Manse will be under contract with a property management firm to initiate the selection for possible tenants.

Pastor Todd announced that he and his fiancé will be hosting an Open House at Bethel Church to get to know each other and get to meet her family.

*Trustees:* Nothing to report

*Deacons:* Deacons will be preparing soups for our shut-ins. It was questioned if they need supplies or donations. Card Shower will be for Bruce Barstow for the month of January. John Louderback had knee surgery. Pastor Todd will call him.

#### Administration & Personnel:

Marsha Brooks and Shirlee Nystrom will be co-chairing the committee. Marsha will be out of town for the next three months and Shirlee has agreed to moderate the meetings in her absence.

#### Care and Reach Out Team:

The Cochran Family lost their home and all their belongings in a house fire on December 22, 2019. Elder Rita Cairnes suggested we solicit donations from Bethel to help the family. Melissa will put an insert in the Sunday bulletins to ask for donations. Motion was approved to advertise the family's needs and Rita Cairnes will be the contact person.

A discussion on starting a NEEDY Fund was initiated. A subcommittee would need to be formulated for strategic planning on how to operate and screen potential candidates in need. Finance Committee and Mission Committee could meet to structure the subcommittee. Further discussions will be addressed at the next Session meeting.

There will be a Flea Market in the Spring in conjunction with the Lions Club.

Hospitality Hour was discussed. Suggestions on how to alleviate the same individuals having to supply the refreshments were discussed. Possibility would be to have a three-month sign-up sheet in the Fellowship Hall and people can sign-up for the day of their choosing. Elder Rita Cairnes will take this suggestion back to her committee.

#### Christian Education:

Acknowledgement of Elder Ruth Walker's participation and organization of the Christmas Eve Early Service with the children.

Finance and Stewardship: Discussed budget issues for 2020. Budget was approved.

*Mission:* Elder Carol Morrow informed the Session the Mission Committee has agreed to send the Presbytery a donation of \$2,100. She presented an article to the Session on Per Capita and what it entails when you pay your Per Capita portion to the church.

*Worship and Music*: Microphone will be passed around during the Welcoming on Sundays for announcements.

The meeting was closed with prayer by Rev. Todd at 9:15 p.m.
