

Psalm 139:1-6, 13-18

- 1 O Lord, you have searched me and known me.
- 2 You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from far away.

Second Lesson

1 Samuel 3:1-10, (11-20)

- 3 Now the boy Samuel was ministering to the Lord under Eli. The word of the Lord was rare in those days; visions were not widespread.
- 2 At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he could not see, was lying down in his room; 3 the lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the Lord, where the ark of God was. 4 Then the Lord called, "Samuel! Samuel!" and he said, "Here I am!" 5 and ran to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call; lie down again." So he went and lay down. 6 The Lord called again, "Samuel!" Samuel got up and went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call, my son; lie down again." 7 Now Samuel did not yet know the Lord, and the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him. 8 The Lord called Samuel again, a third time. And he got up and went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." Then Eli perceived that the Lord was calling the boy. 9 Therefore Eli said to Samuel, "Go, lie down; and if he calls you, you shall say, 'Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." So Samuel went and lay down in his place.
- 10 Now the Lord came and stood there, calling as before, "Samuel! Samuel!" And Samuel said, "Speak, for your servant is listening."
- 11 Then the Lord said to Samuel, "See, I am about to do something in Israel that will make both ears of anyone who hears of it tingle. 12 On that day I will fulfill against Eli all that I have spoken concerning his house, from beginning to end. 13 For I have told him that I am about to punish his house forever, for the iniquity that he knew, because his sons were blaspheming God, and he did not restrain them. 14 Therefore I swear to the house of Eli that the iniquity of Eli's house shall not be expiated by sacrifice or offering forever."
- 15 Samuel lay there until morning; then he opened the doors of the house of the Lord. Samuel was afraid to tell the vision to Eli. 16 But Eli called Samuel and said, "Samuel, my son." He said, "Here I am." 17 Eli said, "What was it that he told you? Do not hide it from me. May God

do so to you and more also, if you hide anything from me of all that he told you." 18 So Samuel told him everything and hid nothing from him. Then he said, "It is the Lord; let him do what seems good to him."

19 As Samuel grew up, the Lord was with him and let none of his words fall to the ground. 20 And all Israel from Dan to Beer-sheba knew that Samuel was a trustworthy prophet of the Lord.

This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Samuel, Chapter 3, centers on the Lord calling on Samuel, but Samuel thinks it is Eli calling him instead. Samuel was an apprentice minister of the Lord, and he worked under the tutelage of Eli. He did so at a time when the Lord rarely spoke to His people and imparting visions was equally rare. So we see this interesting sequence of God speaking to Samuel.

Notice that this was not an inner voice. It was audible, so much so that Samuel was convinced that Eli was calling him. Eli gave Samuel wise counsel. Eli told Samuel to:

- · Make himself available for God to speak.
- · Wait upon the Lord
- · Respond to the word of God
- · Humble himself before God and His word

When we call upon God to speak, we must listen for God. The preacher may speak; our parents may speak; our friends may speak; our teachers may speak; inspirational authors write books we enjoy; we may spend daily time in the scriptures; Christian radio or television personalities may speak; inspirational music or hymns might fill our ears.

That is all good and wonderful, but these words, voices and melodies mean nothing for eternity if we are not open to the Listening for the words of God or the movement of the Spirit when we engage our faith in these and many other ways.

If we refuse to follow the advice Eli gave to Samuel to "Be Still and Listen," we will not recognize the voice of His love, His grace, and His mercy even if it is as plain as day. More importantly, however, we need to start looking at people not as how we see them but as how God intends them to be, that is as children of the most high: called, sanctified, and sealed by His love. In order to look at them that way, we need to listen to them with such an attitude.

Sermon Topic

As Christians, we are called to active listening as a vital component of the receiving and sharing of God's love. When we Listen with ears guided by the Spirit and act out of hearts shaped by the Spirit, we touch others with the love of God.


