



See the Easter Bunny!



Part Two will take place on Saturday, April 24. Our plan is still in formation, but we hope to hand out wildflowers, particularly milkweed, because it attracts Monarch butterflies. The Monarch population is only 10% of what it was a few decades ago. Global warming and other man-made influences have decimated the species.

Providing the butterflies a place to nest, eat, and grow is one small, but significant thing each of us can do to save this beautiful creature of God.


