This Week's Sermon:

Many years ago, in a homiletics journal I came across this commentary on John 3:16.

"For God so loved the world..." stands there against all our attempts to narrow and make specific God's love. Even when we are tempted to narrow the scope of God's love by turning his love into one that only supports our cause, our viewpoints, our church. Even when we are tempted to restrict the scope of Christian love to Christ and the church, we cannot get past the fact that love is the most adequate description of God's attitude toward all creation. His love is not and should not be exclusive to us. It is why even Jesus urges us to treat our enemies with love, because it is exactly through eyes of love that they are viewed by the Father.

"For God so loved the world..." is the beginning of a declarative statement. It is a given. Not only is God's love unconditional for all people, it takes on particular meaning for the individual. It is also unconditional for you and for me. We tend to treat grace as if it were conditional, as if God will love us only if we meet some condition. If we are righteous, we feel God will love us more. If we are educated and literate, God will love us more. God is not distant and unconnected from creation. God loves this creation in time and history and God loves us unconditionally. It is this type of love that Jesus is calling Nicodemus to receive, and it is also this kind of love that is ours through the grace of our Lord. The reality is that God loves us despite our sin and he continues to love and sustain us unconditionally.

"For God so loved the world..." is the beginning of an introduction by the Gospel writer to the reader of God's plan for redemption — that love is the reason for God's continued actions to redeem and restore creation. God in Jesus Christ comes to save and to redeem. God gave himself in Jesus Christ with the desire and intention to redeem us. "For God so loved the world..." that he acted in Jesus Christ. Despite our attempts to narrow the focus of God's love, and our inability at times to accept it unconditionally, the fact of the matter is that when we open ourselves up to the power of the divine, God from above creates in us a new heart; indeed we are reborn from above. When we feel that love and know that grace, we are motivated to the same kind of compassion, hope, and love for all creation and for all of God's children. As we are linked in Jesus Christ to God, so we begin to share his love for creation and bring into the service of that love all of our gifts and talents and desires.

Today we dig into this popular verse from a fresh perspective.
