And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me.' (Mathew 25:40)

When Jesus teaches the beatitudes, he is speaking specifically to his followers. When Jesus ends the section of the sheep in Mathew 25, we see that ministering to others and being thankful for our many blessings helps us to achieve an attitude of divine compassion towards other people.


As we come upon this holiday of Thanksgiving, it is a good time to look at such a text because it reminds us that as Christians we need to do more than simply give thanks for our blessings. We need to show Christian love, sacrifice, and charity as our thanks to God for his blessings. When we share those blessings with others, we understand true thanksgiving.

Out of his love for us and out of our thanks for that love, we should strive to reach out to humanity with the same grace that God has given us and seek to feed the hungry and thirsty, clothe the poor, and shelter the homeless. We can strive to show God's kindness and love in the way we carry ourselves with friends and strangers. We can be God's hand of forgiveness to even those most of society would say do not deserve it.

It can be a very difficult thing to do. It starts by examining our commitment to sharing God's blessings of our resources, time and talent to dig a little deeper or push a little harder to serve others in love. We need to ask ourselves a few questions as well.

Questions to ponder:

Can you make a small commitment, for example, to not pass the Salvation Army kettle a single time this holiday season without putting something in it, or to possibly commit some other gift to the Lord through another organization you may respect?

Can you think of a grudge you may hold against someone you think has wronged you and truly, actively, graciously forgive them in your heart...and then begin acting like it? Can you show that person the face of love?

In the biblical text, one of the definitions of "the least of these" is "children." There is no more important thing we can do than to value and love our children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews to the point that they know they are precious and invaluable in our eyes and in the eyes of God. Can you commit to seeing all children with that same love?

Can you start by trying to adopt an outlook on life that looks to what we can give before it concentrates on what it will get? In American society, that is not an easy task.

When the king addresses these that are called sheep, he says, "Come, you who are blessed of my Father and inherit the kingdom that was prepared for you before the creation of the world." That phrase "blessed of my Father" is not a throwaway line.

Gratitude builds within us an inner nature which makes way for having the type of character that draws the people to the throne of grace when they see God's light shining through us.

In other words, those who belong to this king understand true blessing and Thanksgiving when they live lives that exemplify love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, gentleness, humility and self control. Not just when it's easy, but when it's hard, and even when doing so might be sacrificial.

Such attitude and actions manifest an understanding of faithfulness from a biblical perspective in which God's love flows from an inner nature that is shaped by God and offered freely to others, with thanksgiving and without judgement.

I challenge you today. Join me this Holiday season in not only giving thanks but in actively living a life that embodies the love of God from a perspective of pure gratitude to the divine for all your many blessings.




## 2021 Per Capita





Pumpkin carving, painting and s'mores were the highlights!




Thanks to all who helped plan, and to the families who came out to enjoy this fun afternoon at Bethel!

### Butternut Squash Soup

Stir in large pot:

3 T. butter

3 leeks, chopped

1 vidalia onion, chopped

Add:

1 large potato, peeled and chopped

2 carrots, peeled and chopped

1 large apple, peeled and chopped

1 butternut squash, peeled and chopped

1 quart chicken stock

Cook all of the above until tender.

Add:

2 dashes of ginger

¼ c. apple juice or apple cider

½ cup cream

Salt & pepper

Puree until smooth and enjoy!




