

MALM MM (1)

Tea Ring

Submitted by John Louderback



For tea ring:

1 loaf frozen bread dough
1/2 c. white sugar
3 tsp. butter or margarine
2 tsp. cinnamon
1/2 c. chopped nuts (walnuts or pecans)
raisins (optional)

For icing:

1/2 c. confectioner's sugar (can use more if desired)3 Tbsp. butter, melted2 tsp. vanillasmall amount of milk

Let bread dough thaw to room temperature to about twice its size. Roll out onto floured surface to 9x18 inches. Spread butter on dough; sprinkle sugar, cinnamon, nuts, and raisins if desired. Roll lengthwise and pinch ends to form a circle on greased pizza pan. Slash with sharp knife all around dough circle, about 1" apart. Cover with plastic wrap. Let rise at room temperature to twice its size. Bake in 350 degree oven for 15 minutes. Remove immediately from pizza pan onto a large plate. Ice while hot.
